

Conservancy helps city with landscaping

A team from the Catalina Island Conservancy worked diligently on Friday, Aug. 18 to remove invasive grass from City Hall Landscaping. The grass, known as Mexican Feathergrass, has recently been removed from other city landscaped

areas as well. The Conservancy is working cooperatively with the city to replace the Mexican Feathergrass with other native species more appropriate for landscaping in Avalon.

New native species, grown at the local Ackerman Family Plant Nursery, are scheduled to be planted around the City Hall Campus in the late fall.
